Week One:

Introduction to Speech Class

Learning Objectives: Introduction to class, discuss verbals and nonverbals

Week Two:

Practice Giving your Expository Speech, using your visual aid and outline (due week 3)

Week Three:

Present 2-4 minute Expository Speeches using visual aids

Learning Objectives: learn how to formulate a layout for giving your testimony

Prepare an outline for your 2-4 minute testimony speech (due week 4)

Using your outline, practice giving your testimony speech (due week 4)

Week Four:

Present 2-4 minute Testimony Speeches

Learning Objectives: Learn how to create a persuasive argument and develop a persuasive speech

Prepare an Outline for a 2-4 minute Persuasive Speech (use at least three outside sources) (due week 5)

Using your outline, practice giving your persuasive speech (due week 5)

Week Five:

Present 2-4 minute Persuasive Speeches

Learning Objectives: Learn how to filter through and analyze poetry

Discuss the poem, "If", by: Rudyard Kipling

Memorize the first two stanzas of "If" by: Rudyard Kipling (due week 6)

Week Six:

Present the first two stanzas of "If", by: Rudyard Kipling

Learning objectives: Learn the value of Impromptu Speeches, present Impromptu Speeches in Class, and learn how to create a 2-4 minute Extemporaneous (current event) speech.

Prepare an Outline for a 2-4 minute Current Event Speech (due week 7)

Using your outline, practice giving your Current Event Speech (due week 7)

Week Seven:

Present 2-4 minute Extemporaneous Speeches

Review: Expository Speeches, Testimony Speeches, Persuasive, Impromptu, and Extemporaneous Study for a Test over the terms and key aspects of the speeches we have presented (due week 8)
